GENDER IDENTITY TERMINOLOGY

Gender – includes two related concepts:

Gender Identity which refers to a person's internal and individual experience of gender; and
Gender Expression which describes how a person publicly presents their gender including behaviour and outward appearance. A person's current gender may differ from the gender a person as assigned at birth (male or female) and may differ from what is indicated on their current legal documents. A person's gender may change over time.

Cisgender – people whose sex assigned at birth is the same as their gender.

Transgender – people whose sex assigned at birth is different from their gender.

Woman – people whose current gender is woman. This includes cisgender and transgender people who are women.

Man – people whose current gender is man. This includes cisgender and transgender people who are men.

Non-Binary Gender – people whose current gender is not exclusively a woman or a man. This includes people who do not have one gender, have no gender, are gender fluid, or are Two-Spirit.
